IMPORTANT REMINDER: ALL VISITORS TO STILLWATER SCHOOL MUST SIGN IN AT THE MAIN OFFICE UPON ARRIVAL AND SIGN OUT WHEN LEAVING.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

ABSENTEE CALLS: All absences must be reported directly to our dedicated attendance line: 973-383-3227. Kindly keep this number handy. DO NOT call the main school phone number or use the personal voice mail of our nurse, Maureen Beckman. The nurse's voice mail should be used for health concerns other than attendance.

SCHOOL HOURS: The school day is 8:25 AM until 3:00 PM for all children. Whenever possible, ALL children should be strongly encouraged to take the bus in order to ensure that they are on time. WALKERS AND/OR CHILDREN WHO ARE DROPPED OFF BY THEIR PARENTS SHOULD NOT ARRIVE TO SCHOOL PRIOR TO 8:15 AM. Thank you for your cooperation.

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE: Students need to be in school every day to stay on track. Teachers' lesson plans are carefully constructed to introduce new concepts, reinforce them with learning activities, and then move on to new skills and ideas. When children aren't in school they can easily fall behind. The more days they miss, the harder it is to catch up. Families will be contacted via a mailing after a child accumulates four unexcused absences, again when a child accumulates five to nine unexcused absences, and finally when the child has ten or more unexcused absences. After ten unexcused absences, if the district determines that the compulsory attendance law has been violated, a court referral may be made, as required by district policy and New Jersey State Law (N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.6). Please ensure that if your child is absent that you follow up with written documentation to avoid an unexcused absence. Definitions of excused absences can be found on the district website under the *Parent Resources* tab.

BUS STOP REMINDER: Parents/Guardians — It is important that you are at your child's(ren's) bus stop on time. If you have not signed a waiver stating that your child may be let off without someone present, the bus will return your child to school if a designated person is not there to receive them. **A \$25 charge is incurred by the family if the bus has to return to the school with your child(ren).** Thank-you for your cooperation!

SIGNING STUDENTS OUT: All students who are leaving the school building must be signed out by a parent/guardian or authorized person. If your child will not be riding the bus home (ex: staying for an after-school activity, or being picked up), a green bus note must be sent in that morning to the homeroom teacher. For students attending KEEP or First Impressions, or being picked up on a regularly SCHEDULED basis, please write that in a note (preferably on a green bus note) including the details of child's specific schedule, bus route number, and a contact person for our records. NEWS FROM THE NURSE: Recently we have had several children in multiple grade levels with coxsackie virus infections. This illness is also commonly called hand, foot, and mouth disease. The disease occurs most often in children but adults can also get the infection. Symptoms may include fever, sores in the mouth, and a skin rash that often appears on the hands and feet. The rash begins as red, raised spots which may develop blisters. The mouth sores may also become ulcers. The coxsackie virus can spread through nose and throat secretions, fluid from open blisters, or stool from infected people. To help prevent the spread of infection, practice good hand hygiene and disinfect contaminated surfaces. The disease will run its course and rarely causes serious illness or complications. There is no specific treatment for hand, foot, and mouth disease. Children should stay home if they have a fever and until any blisters have scabbed over. People may continue to be contagious even after all of the symptoms have resolved. Therefore, practicing good hand washing and avoiding touching the eyes, nose, and mouth are the best ways to lower your chances of catching the virus.

PARCC TESTING UPDATE: Stillwater Township School students in grades 3-8 will be taking the PARCC (Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers) Assessment this spring, as will students in public schools statewide. While schedules are not yet official, the state has provided 'Administration Windows,' which the school would like to share for your information. PARCC is a two-part test. The first block of testing, called the Performance Based Assessment, will occur from March 2 – 27, 2015. The second block of testing, called the End of Year Assessment, will occur from April 27 – May 22, 2015. Further information about specific grade levels' testing dates and times will be forthcoming – expect communication about this from your child's teacher in the near future.
