IMPORTANT INFORMATION

<u>ABSENTEE CALLS:</u> All absences must be reported directly to our dedicated attendance line <u>by 9:30am</u> - <u>973-383-3227.</u> Kindly keep in mind, this number is for **Absentee Calls ONLY**. If you need to speak directly to the nurse Maureen Beckman or leave a message for her, she can be reached at 973-383-6171 ext. 216. The nurse's voice mail should be used for health concerns **other than attendance.**

SCHOOL HOURS: The school day is 8:25 AM until 3:00 PM for all children. Whenever possible, ALL children should be strongly encouraged to take the bus in order to ensure that they are on time. WALKERS AND/OR CHILDREN WHO ARE DROPPED OFF BY THEIR PARENTS SHOULD NOT ARRIVE TO SCHOOL PRIOR TO 8:15 AM.

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE: Students need to be in school every day to stay on track. Teachers' lesson plans are carefully constructed to introduce new concepts, reinforce them with learning activities, and then move on to new skills and ideas. When children aren't in school they can easily fall behind. The more days they miss, the harder it is to catch up. Families will be contacted via a mailing after a child accumulates four unexcused absences, again when a child accumulates five to nine unexcused absences, and finally when the child has ten or more unexcused absences. Letters are automatically generated by our data system. After ten unexcused absences, if the district determines that the compulsory attendance law has been violated, a court referral may be made, as required by district policy and New Jersey State Law (N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.6). Please ensure that if your child is absent that you follow up with written documentation to avoid an unexcused absence. Definitions of excused absences can be found on the district website under the Parent Resources tab.

<u>BUS STOP REMINDER:</u> Parents/Guardians – It is important that you are at your child's(ren's) bus stop on time. If you have not signed a waiver stating that your child may be let off without someone present, the bus will return your child to school if a designated person is not there to receive them. <u>A \$25 charge is incurred by the family if the bus has to return to the school with your child(ren).</u>

SIGNING STUDENTS OUT: All students who are leaving the school building must be signed out by a parent/guardian or <u>authorized</u> person. If your child will not be riding the bus home (ex: staying for an after-school activity, or being picked up), a green bus note <u>must</u> be sent in that morning to the homeroom teacher. For students attending KEEP or First Impressions, or being picked up on a <u>regularly SCHEDULED basis</u>, please write that in a note (preferably on a green bus note) including the details of child's specific schedule, <u>bus route number</u>, and a contact person for our records. <u>Any phone calls, or email requests regarding your child's end of the day dismissal must be made before 12:00pm unless it is an emergency situation</u>. For requests made after 12:00pm, a decision will be made by administration as to whether or not we will be able to honor that request. Any questions, please contact Mrs. Roberts or Mrs. Rovcroft.

SECOND GRADE NEWS: Hooray, spring is almost here! What is your favorite thing about this time of year? The second graders are writing to express their opinions. They are trying to convince others to agree with them by giving reasons, examples, and facts to support their opinion. As with narrative and informative writing, each paragraph has a topic sentence, three or more details, and a conclusion. We hope to see you at the second grade spring celebration and egg hunt on March 29th.

THIRD GRADE NEWS: We are in the midst of our character studies unit in our Reading Workshop! The third graders just wrapped up their novel study on <u>Because of Winn Dixie</u>. They learned some new vocabulary words including protagonist and secondary characters. Our main focus was on character traits, both physical and personality. We studied not only Opal, the protagonist, but also secondary characters and their traits as well. Next, we will be continuing our character studies unit by reading <u>Charlie and the Chocolate Factory</u>. During that novel, we will study how the various characters change from the beginning of the novel through the end.

<u>FOURTH GRADE NEWS:</u> Fourth grade science students have been learning about how plants can affect the environment. Fourth graders worked in teams and researched the Kudzu Vine to find out what effects it has on the environment. Each team then created a skit, slide show, or poster about this highly invasive vine. Everyone really had fun completing this activity and, of course, enjoyed presenting to classmates! We are about to start our next unit on plate tectonics. 4th grade science is so much fun!

<u>SIXTH GRADE LANGUARGE ARTS NEWS:</u> Sixth grade students recently read different books in class. During this literature unit students were divided into three groups. The three books selected to read were <u>Star in the Storm</u> by Joan Hiatt Harlow, <u>Smart Dog</u> by Vivian Vande Velde, and <u>A Dog's Life</u> by Ann Martin.

Students read, discussed and completed activities to strengthen reading comprehension skills. Lessons focused on identifying and analyzing different story elements including characters, setting, theme, and plot. Students created a vocabulary board with lists of new words. Each day students read as a group, or independently, and many students had the opportunity to lead a small group activity. All students also enjoyed a fourth book called Swindle by Gordon Korman which was read aloud.

GIRLS ON THE RUN: Our team of third, fourth, and sixth grade girls has been working together on some great lessons. They are working on things like connections, respect, kindness, and friendship. The girls learn to work very well together and show what it means to be a team. After their 20 meetings, the girls will run or walk in a 5K in Sparta.

<u>FAMILY MATH:</u> More fun-filled nights of Family Math have happened! Parents and children worked together doing a Hurkle game, a fraction activity, rainbow logic, and calculator paths. Congratulations to Abby Ando, Trent Funari and Ryan Broderick who won the estimation jar of cookies and pretzels. Our last class will be held Thursday, March 22nd. Third grade Family Math graduation will occur!
