ABSENTEE CALLS: Please call the attendance line <u>383-3227</u> when calling your child out of school. Do not use the personal voice mail of our nurse, Maureen Beckman. The nurse's voice mail should be used for health concerns other than attendance.

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE: Students need to be in school every day to stay on track. Teachers' lesson plans are carefully constructed to introduce new concepts, reinforce them with learning activities, and then move on to new skills and ideas. When children aren't in school they can easily fall behind. And the more days they miss, the harder it is to catch up.

BUS STOP REMINDER: Parents/Guardians – It is important that you are at your child's(ren's) bus stop on time. If you have not signed a waiver stating that your child may be let off without someone present, the bus will return your child to school if a designated person is not there to receive them. A \$25 charge is incurred by the family if the bus has to return to the school with your child(ren). Thank-you for your cooperation!

GUIDELINES FOR DROPPING OFF STUDENTS:

- Enter driveway near the church, which is a one-way entrance from 8:15am – 8:45am.
- 2. Please stay in line. Do not pass other vehicles or buses.
- 3. Drop off students at the curb only and please try to get them out of your vehicle promptly.
- You may pass a bus parked in the lot during our dismissal, however, we ask that you exercise extreme caution.
- 5. Should you need to come into the school with your child, please use a parking space to the right when you enter the driveway and escort your child into the school.
- Visitors must report to the main office prior to going anywhere in the building. This procedure was developed with the safety of your children our only priority.



NEWS FROM THE NURSE: Since returning from the holiday break, some of our students have come down with a variety of seasonal illness including influenza like illness, strep throat, and a gastrointestinal illness with vomiting and diarrhea. Please keep children home from school if he/she has a fever the evening before or the morning of a school day. An oral or tympanic temperature (ear temp) of 100 degrees F is considered to be a low grade fever. Children should be kept home if they are vomiting or have diarrhea. Strep tests continue to be available in school but it is preferable that a child with a fever be taken to the doctor for a strep test to help prevent transmission of the infection in school. Practicing good hand hygiene, avoiding touching the T zone (eyes, nose, and mouth), and avoiding contact with sick individuals will help prevent the spread of most infections. It is more difficult to prevent the spread of influenza. Influenza is primarily spread through air droplet and is contagious for about 24 hours before symptoms appear. The best protection against the flu is getting an annual flu shot. We will do our best to prevent the spread of infections in school by encouraging hand hygiene, cleaning surfaces, and sending sick children home from school. Hopefully, with your help at home, this period of increased illnesses will pass quickly and we will have a healthy
