ABSENTEE CALLS: Please call the attendance line <u>383-3227</u> when calling your child out of school. Do not use the personal voice mail of our nurse, Maureen Beckman. The nurse's voice mail should be used for health concerns other than attendance.

IMPORTANT REMINDER

ALL VISITORS TO STILLWATER SCHOOL MUST SIGN IN AT THE MAIN OFFICE UPON ARRIVAL AND SIGN OUT WHEN LEAVING.

BUS STOP REMINDER: Parents/Guardians — It is important that you are at your child's(ren's) bus stop on time. If you have not signed a waiver stating that your child may be let off without someone present, the bus will return your child to school if a designated person is not there to receive them. **A \$25 charge is incurred by the family if the bus has to return to the school with your child(ren).** Thank-you for your cooperation!

BUS NOTE GUIDELINES: In an effort to provide a safe and sound dismissal for your child(ren), and to avoid end of the day confusion, we are asking you to abide by the following guidelines when changing your child's dismissal arrangements.

<u>Please send your bus notes to school in the morning with your child.</u> This will help to eliminate the number of students who need to make a phone call from the office to home. It is important to note that time spent in the office is time he/she is losing in the classroom.

We understand there are occasional situations that require a last minute change in plans. If you discover during the day that you will need to pick your child up at the end of the day, (or need him/her to go home with another student) please call the office to let us know as early possible during the day, so we can follow the steps to assure that the student and teacher receive the information. Please try not to wait until dismissal time to give us this information, unless it's an emergency situation.

Important things to help us in the office to efficiently handle all bus notes:

- Please PRINT your child's name and all other information clearly on the bus note.
- Always include your child's bus number on the form.
- If you are requesting that your child go home on another bus with another student, you must include the route number of the bus you would like your child to ride on, as well as clearly writing the name of the student he/she will be riding with. You will receive a call from the office if we cannot accommodate your request.

Thank you for your cooperation. Keeping our teachers and office staff well informed will ensure a smooth end of the day process. If you have any questions, feel free to call Dan Cullen at 973-383-6171.

GUIDELINES FOR DROPPING OFF STUDENTS:

- 1. Enter driveway near the church, which is a one-way entrance from 8:15am 8:45am.
- 2. Please stay in line. Do not pass other vehicles or buses.
- 3. Drop off students at the curb only and please try to get them out of your vehicle promptly.
- 4. You may pass a bus parked in the lot during our dismissal, however, we ask that you exercise extreme caution.
- Should you need to come into the school with your child, please use a parking space to the right when you enter the driveway and escort your child into the school.
- Visitors must report to the main office prior to going anywhere in the building. This procedure was developed with the safety of your children our only priority.
