

IMPORTANT REMINDER

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE: Students need to be in school every day to stay on track. LOG IT! - From April 29th - May 10th, the Physical Education department will be running a program called LOG IT! The program encourages students to get outside and be physically active in addition to the Physical Education classroom. The

program also teaches responsibility, the benefits of exercising, integrates math, and is a lot of fun! Each day of the week, students in grades 3-6 will have an opportunity to choose a way to be physically active outside of school hours either alone, with family or friends. Some exercises that could be performed include running, walking, sports practice/game, bike riding, etc. Each day the students will log their own number of minutes that they were physically active on their LOG IT! sheets. At the end of each week the students will add up their daily minutes of physical activity and record their grand total at the bottom of their LOG IT! sheets. Completed LOG IT! sheets should be signed by a parent/guardian and turned into Mr. Reed, Mrs. Hayes or Ms. Radimer. At the end of the two weeks, each class that logs at least 1,500 total minutes will receive a free gym period where the class gets to choose the games for that day! The class totaling the highest number of minutes for each grade level will receive ice pops in addition to their free gym period!

MAY IS BETTER HEARING AND SPEECH MONTH!

Children with communication disorders frequently do not perform on grade level because they have difficulty understanding and talking, struggle with reading and writing, misunderstand social cues, show poor judgment, have trouble taking tests, and may avoid school. Is this your child? Children with communication problems have difficulty learning to listen, speak, read, or write. Parents and teachers should refer any student who shows signs of a speech and language problem to the school-based speech-language pathologist for an evaluation immediately. "It's crucial that children are identified and begin treatment as early as possible because summer break will only compound the consequences of a communication disorder if left untreated," Mrs. McGregor says. Parents should look out for the various types of speech and language disorders that affect school-age children, including:

- Speech sound disorders (difficulty pronouncing sounds)
- <u>Language</u> disorders (difficulty understanding others and expressing themselves)
- Cognitive-communication disorders (difficulty with thinking skills including perception, memory, awareness, reasoning, judgment, intellect, and imagination)
- Stuttering (fluency) disorders (interruption of the flow of speech that may include hesitations, repetitions, or prolongations of sounds or words)
- Voice disorders (quality of voice that may include hoarseness, nasality, or loudness)
