MORNING DROP OFF: Morning Drop off is available in the gym from 8:00 – 8:25 a.m. Students being dropped off cannot enter the building until 8:00 am. Any drop at 8:25 or after is at the main entrance after all buses have unloaded.

THIRD GRADE NEWS:

In third grade students are finishing up their unit in Math on multiplying by multiples of ten. During the next unit, students will be applying their multiplication skills to problem solve two step word problems. In Reading, third grade students are reading "Because of Winn-Dixie" during our Character Study Unit. The students have been enjoying reading all about the main character Opal and her pet dog Winn-Dixie. Students will take what they have learned about plot, setting, and character development from "Because of Winn-Dixie" to create their own fictional narratives during Writing Class. The next topic we will be studying in Science are fossils!

FOURTH GRADE ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS NEWS:

Fourth graders have recently finished writing opinion essays. These well-organized pieces of writing were passionate and clear. There is no shortage of strong opinions in fourth grade English Language Arts! We have begun reading *Number the Stars* by Lois Lowry, a Newbery winning novel that tells a story of two friends living in Denmark during World War II. It has been interesting to see how the complexities of the war impacted the lives of the Danish children in the book. Love of reading week comes just in time for us to dig into our new novel even more!

FIFTH GRADE LANGUAGE ARTS NEWS:

Fifth Grade Language Arts students have started reading a fantastic novel, <u>Maniac Magee</u>, by Jerry Spinelli. The students are enjoying reading and following along with the life of Jeffery (Maniac) Magee in class. This novel touches on important themes like family, racism and courage. Students will be learning and using the skills of character development, inference, setting, foreshadowing, cause and effect, and many others.

FIFTH GRADE NEWS:

On Thursday, the 5th graders at Stillwater School participated in the Annual Colonial Fair! For one month, the students in Mrs. Steffens' history classes study the thirteen original colonies of America and what life was like for people during this time period. Each group of students represented a colony, a trade and created a family back story to their character. During the fair, students were answering questions and working hard to stay in character while the parents and other family members walked through to see them show off their knowledge! What a great job all of the students did this year! What a great way to learn about the original people who worked so hard to make America what it is today!

SCHOOL STORE NEWS:

Beginning on February 7th the school store will be open the first Thursday of each month during lunch periods. All items are \$1.00 or less. Thank you, Mrs. Riva, Mrs. Najemian, Mrs. Graupe

ABSENTEE CALLS: All absences must be reported directly to our dedicated attendance line **by 9:30am** - **973-383-3227**. Kindly keep in mind this number is for **Absentee Calls ONLY**. If you need to speak directly to the nurse Maureen Beckman or leave a message for her, she can be reached at 973-383-6171 ext. 216. The nurse's voice mail should be used for health concerns **other than attendance**.

SCHOOL HOURS: The school day is 8:25 AM until 3:06 PM for all children. Whenever possible, ALL children should be strongly encouraged to take the bus in order to ensure that they are on time. Morning drop-off is available in the gym from 8:00-8:25 am. Any drop-off after 8:25 is at the main entrance after the buses have unloaded.

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE: Students need to be in school every day to stay on track. Teachers' lesson plans are carefully constructed to introduce new concepts, reinforce them with learning activities, and then move on to new skills and ideas. When children aren't in school they can easily fall behind. The more days they miss, the harder it is to catch up. **Families will be contacted via a mailing after a child accumulates four unexcused absences, again when a child accumulates five to nine unexcused absences, and finally when the child has ten or more unexcused absences. Letters are automatically generated by our data system. After ten unexcused absences, if the district determines that the compulsory attendance law has been violated, a court referral may be made, as required by district policy and New Jersey State Law (N.J.A.C. 6A:16-7.6). Please ensure that if your child is absent that you follow up with written documentation to avoid an unexcused absence. Definitions of excused absences can be found on the district website under the** *Parent Resources* **tab.**

BUS STOP REMINDER: Parents/Guardians – It is important that you are at your child's (ren's) bus stop on time. If you have not signed a waiver stating that your child may be let off without someone present, the bus will return your child to school if a designated person is not there to receive them. **A \$25 charge is incurred by the family if the bus has to return to the school with your child(ren).** As of 9/1/19, the Stocker Bus Company will be increasing the charge.

MORNING DROP OFF: Morning Drop off is available in the gym from 8:00 – 8:25 a.m. Students being dropped off cannot enter the building until 8:00 am. Any drop at 8:25 or after is at the main entrance after all buses have unloaded.

AFTERNOON PICK UP: Parents will need to wait outside the gym doors and your child/children will be brought out to you. You will be greeted at the doors by a staff member to sign out your child/children. Once you have signed them out, a staff member will bring the students to you at the door.

AFTERSCHOOL ACTIVITIES PICKUP:

If your child is staying for any after school activity, it is your responsibility to pick up your child at the designated time. We know that emergencies can occur, however, there is no one to answer the switchboard after 4:00 p.m. If an emergency occurs please plan for an alternate or emergency contact to pick your child up from the activity.

SIGNING STUDENTS OUT: All students who are leaving the school building must be signed out by a parent/guardian or <u>authorized</u> person. If your child will not be riding the bus home (ex: staying for an after-school activity, or being picked up), a green bus note <u>must</u> be sent in that morning to the homeroom teacher. For students attending KEEP or First Impressions, or being picked up on a <u>regularly SCHEDULED basis</u>, please write that in a note (preferably on a green bus note) including the details of child's specific schedule, <u>bus route number</u>, and a contact person for our records. <u>Any phone calls, or email requests regarding your child's end of the day dismissal must be made before 12:00pm unless it is an emergency situation.</u> For requests made after 12:00pm, a decision will be made by administration as to whether or not we will be able to honor that request. Any questions, please contact Mrs. Roberts or Mrs. Roycroft.

REAL TIME PARENT PORTAL: Please remember to login to the Real time parent portal and update your child(ren)'s contact information if needed as well as filling out any forms for the current school year.

REMINDER TO PARENTS:

Students are not to bring personal items for play into school. Various balls and equipment for recess are provided by the school. Thank you for your cooperation.
