The Stillwater Township Board of Education met on March 18, 2019, at 7:00 p.m. in the Stillwater School Library for a Committee of the Whole Board of Education Meeting.

The meeting was called to order by Dennis DeGroat at 7:00 p.m. In accordance with the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Law, the time, date and location of this meeting was provided to the New Jersey Herald & Star Ledger on March 1, 2019. Notices were posted in the Stillwater School, Town Hall, Lakeland Bank, Stillwater Post Office, Middleville Post Office, Swartswood Post Office and the Stillwater School Website.

BUDGET & FINANCE

Mrs. LoCascio

1. Mrs. Metzgar presented the 2019-2020 tentative budget. She explained the budget process, distributed an updated budget calendar, and reviewed the recent state aid formula changes. Mrs. Metzgar also reviewed the revenues, expenditures, including various capital projects and enrollment numbers. The tentative budget proposed a 2% tax levy increase, and a review of the estimated tax impact was discussed.

2. Motion made by Mrs. LoCascio, second by Mrs. Nothstine to introduce the preliminary 2019-2020 School Budget and authorize the School Business Administrator to submit the preliminary budget to the Sussex County Office of Education for compliance and approval for advertisement as follows:

As per NJAC 6A:23A-7.3, the proposed budget provides for a maximum expenditure amount that may be allotted for travel and expense reimbursement. The maximum amount of travel and expense reimbursement for the 2018-2019 budget was \$15,000. As of March 1, 2019 the amount spent to date is \$2,008.17. The 2019-2020 tentative budget includes a maximum travel appropriation of \$10,000. The School Business Administrator shall track and record these costs to insure that the maximum amount is not exceeded. Included in the 2019-2020 proposed budget is a maximum regular business travel amount of \$1,500 per employee.

A roll call vote was taken and unanimously approved.

- 3. Motion made by Mrs. LoCascio, second by Mrs. Svendsen to retroactively accept tuition student #020513 for the Behavioral Disabilities Program beginning February 25, 2019 to June 30, 2019 from the Sandyston-Walpack Board of Education. Tuition to be prorated based off annual amount of \$20,000 plus any additional services/aide. A voice vote was taken and unanimously approved.
- 4. Motion made by Mrs. LoCascio, second by Mrs. Svendsen to approve transfers from January 1, 2019 to January 31, 2019 as attached. A voice vote was taken and unanimously approved.
